It is assumed that offerers will provide additional contact information to facilitate more detailed inquiries.

Column one of the Summary Table describes the subsections of subparts B and C of the Standards. The second column describes the supporting features of the product or refers you to the corresponding detailed table, “e.g., equivalent facilitation.” The third column contains any additional remarks and explanations regarding the product. In the subsequent tables, the first column contains the lettered paragraphs of the subsections. The second column describes the supporting features of the product with regard to that paragraph. The third column contains any additional remarks and explanations regarding the product.

Supports with Exceptions	In most cases PDF documents created using AEM Forms PDF Generator can include alternate text descriptions for non-text elements with some exceptions including documents converted from HTML pages and some other formats, including some Open Office documents.
(b) Equivalent alternatives for any multimedia presentation shall be synchronized with the presentation.	Not Applicable	AEM Forms PDF Generator does not utilize multimedia presentations.
(c) Web pages shall be designed so that all information conveyed with color is also available without color, for example from context or markup.	Supports	It is possible for authors to meet this requirement with AEM Forms PDF Generator but they must check their source documents to ensure compliance.

(j) Pages shall be designed to avoid causing the screen to flicker with a frequency greater than 2 Hz and lower than 55 Hz.	Supports	Documents created using AEM Forms PDF Generator do not use flashing or blinking text, objects, or other elements in the user interface.
(k) A text-only page, with equivalent information or functionality, shall be provided to make a web site comply with the provisions of this part, when compliance cannot be accomplished in any other way. Supports	<p>Forms in documents created using AEM Forms PDF Generator can include identity, role and state information that is available to Assistive Technology. These forms can be fully operable using a keyboard alone.</p> <p>However, successful conversion of all of these attributes depends on the format and structure of the source document.</p> <p>Forms that have been generated from insufficiently prepared source files may need additional modification using either Adobe Acrobat Professional or AEM Forms Designer to ensure compliance.</p>
(o) A method shall be provided that permits users to skip repetitive navigation links.	Supports	<p>In general, documents created using PDF generator do not contain repetitive navigation links.</p> <p>Authors can use structural tags, such as headings, lists and tables that can be utilized by Assistive Technology to skip over repetitive blocks of content.</p>
(p) When a timed response is required, the user shall be alerted and given sufficient time to indicate more time is required.	Not Applicable	Documents created using AEM Forms PDF Generator do not require timed responses.
