



PSLT – Adobe Font Folio (2016v1)

1. For the purpose of this Font Folio PSLT, “On-Premise Software” means the Adobe or third party fonts, related explanatory written materials and files, and any modified versions and copies of, and upgrades, updates and additions to, such information, provided to Customer by Adobe at any time, to the extent not provided under a separate agreement.
2. **License.** Customer may install the On-Premise Software on 20 Computers (the “Permitted Number”) unless otherwise indicated under a valid license (e.g., volume license) granted by Adobe. Customer may not install the On-Premise Software onto any server, including internal networks, or use it for any operations not initiated by an individual user.
3. Customer may use the On-Premise Software on Computers as described in Section 2 and output the font software to any output device(s) connected to such Computer(s).
4. If the Permitted Number of Computers is twenty (20), Customer may download the On-Premise Software to the memory (hard disk or RAM) of one output device connected to at least two (2) of such Computers for the purpose of having the On-Premise Software remain resident in such output device, and on one additional such output device for every multiple of twenty (20) represented by the Permitted Number of Computers.
5. Customer may take a copy of the On-Premise Software Customer has used for a particular file to a commercial printer or other service bureau, and such service bureau may use the On-Premise Software to process Customer’s file, provided such service bureau has a valid license to use that particular On-Premise Software.
6. Customer may convert and install the On-Premise Software into another format for use in other environments, subject to the following conditions: A computer on which the converted On-Premise Software is used or installed will be considered as one of Customer’s Permitted Number of Computers. Use of the On-Premise Software Customer has converted will be pursuant to all the terms and conditions of this agreement. Such converted On-Premise Software may be used only for Customer’s own customary internal business or personal use and may not be distributed or transferred for any purpose.
7. Customer may embed copies of the On-Premise Software into Customer’s electronic documents for the purpose of printing and viewing the document. If the On-Premise Software Customer is embedding is identified as “licensed for editable embedding” on Adobe’s website at <http://www.adobe.com/products/type/font-licensing/additional-license-rights.html>, Customer may also embed copies of that On-Premise Software for the additional purpose of editing Customer’s electronic documents. No other embedding rights are implied or permitted under this license.
8. If the On-Premise Software Customer wishes to modify is identified as “licensed for modification” on Adobe’s website at: <http://www.adobe.com/products/type/font-licensing/additional-license-rights.html>, Customer may also modify the On-Premise Software provided that such modified On-Premise Software is used only for Customer’s own customary internal business or personal use and may not be distributed or transferred for any purpose. The On-Premise Software listed on the website as non-modifiable may be converted in accordance with Section 6 above but may not be otherwise modified in any way.
9. Upon installing an upgrade or update, Customer may only continue to use a simultaneous installation of the previous version of the On-premise Software to assist Customer in the transition to the upgrade or update for a reasonable period of time (not to exceed 180 days), after which period, Customer must uninstall and cease using the previous version. Except for this limited right to simultaneous installation and use, this right does not otherwise constitute an increase in the scope of use granted to Customer under this Agreement.
10. **Third-Party Notices.** The creators or third party licensors of certain public standards and publicly available code (“Third Party Materials”), require that certain notices be passed through to the end users of the On-premise Software. These third party notices are located at www.adobe.com/products/eula/third_party/index.html (or a successor website thereto). The inclusion of these third party notices does not limit Adobe’s obligations to the Customer for Third Party Materials integrated into the On-premise Software.
